Hazards

Road crossings. Some walking on lanes and narrow roads without pavements. Some paths are shared with cyclists. Deep water, strong tides, and mudflats close to the route.

Accessibility

There are no stiles or gates less than one metre wide on the route. To avoid steps on the railway footbridge use Sychnant Pass Road and Bangor Road. To avoid a stepped narrow path through Bodlondeb Wood join Marine Walk before the school. Noisey traffic crossing the dual carriageway. Plenty of shortcut options.

Navigation

Following obvious paths and roads.

Terrain

Mostly pavements and roads with some block paving and crushed stone paths which may be muddy in places.

Town and estuary walk

An enjoyable walk through picturesque Conwy passing the marina, estuary, nature reserve, town walls and castle.

Distance: 3.7 miles (6km) Ascent: 116m (381ft) Time: Allow 1h 30m to 2h 30m

- 1 From the hostel head down the driveway.
- 2 Turn right onto Sychnant Pass Road, then first left onto Cadnant Park.
- 3 Turn left onto Mountain Road, take the first right and continue onto the path between Beechwood Court and the private road.
- Cross the railway at the footbridge and cross Bangor Road onto Morfa Drive. Pass the school and go through the gate by the cattle grid.
- Cross over the dual carriageway, turn left onto Ellis Way, turn right onto Telford Close and take the path on the left between the houses.
- 6 At the marina bear left and follow the promenade to Beacons Way. Turn right and pass through the car park to Deganwy Morfa beach.
- 7 Retrace the route to the school.
- 8 Turn left for step free access to Marine Walk.
- Turn left between the school and car park. Before reaching the woods take the narrow path on the left.
- Turn right onto Marine Walk to follow alongside the estuary. When the path emerges onto a narrow road, bear left onto Lower Gate Street, through the town wall and along the quayside.
- At the RNLI building head up the ramp and through the town wall.
- Turn right onto Castle Street. At the Bluebell pub cross the road to the gates and pass through the churchyard.
- 13 Turn right onto Church Street. At High Street bear left to the statue and turn right along Lancaster Square.
- 1 Turn left onto Upper Gate Street, head uphill and take the pedestrian route to the left of the archway through the town wall.
- (b) Continue onto Sychnant Pass Road and back to the hostel.
