Following obvious paths and roads. Coast path from Peveril Point is marked by direction stones.


## Terrain

## **Route directions**

Map: OS Explorer (OL 15) Purbeck & South Dorset Start/Finish: Grid ref SZ 030 784 what3words ///departure.contoured.pony

- From the hostel turn left onto Cluny Crescent and turn right onto Stafford Road.
- 2 Turn right onto High Street. Cross at the Zebra crossing, then bear right onto The Square.
- 3 Turn right onto the seafront and stay on it alongside the road.
- 4 At the entrance to Swanage Pier and the Sailing Club take the right hand road and pass the columns and Amphitheatre.
- 5 At the turning area continue ahead on Peveril Point Road.
- 6 At the Lifeboat station entrance bear right onto the uphill path, continue to the Coastwatch station and then to Peveril Point.
- Turn around to pass the Coastwatch station again and bear left onto the South West Coast Path.
- 8 At Belle Vue Road go straight ahead.
- Turn right onto Durlston Road, then left onto Grosvenor Road, which becomes Cluny Crescent, and to the hostel.
