- Download the OS Maps and what3words apps to your phone.
- To be able to contact emergency services by text visit relayuk.bt.com/emergencysms or text 'register' to 999.

Hazards

Some walking on the pavement alongside the busy Wellesbourne Road. No pavement on Alveston Lane. Deep water at the weir.

Accessibility

One stile to reach the weir. The footpath to the church is narrow with gates less than one metre wide at both ends. Avoid the stile and gates by staying on Alveston Lane.

Navigation

Following obvious paths and roads.

Terrain

Mostly paved/tarmac. The section to the weir is unpaved, uneven and may be muddy after rain.



Facilities (see map)

No toilets or shops on route. Food, drink and toilets available at the YHA. Pub in Alveston.

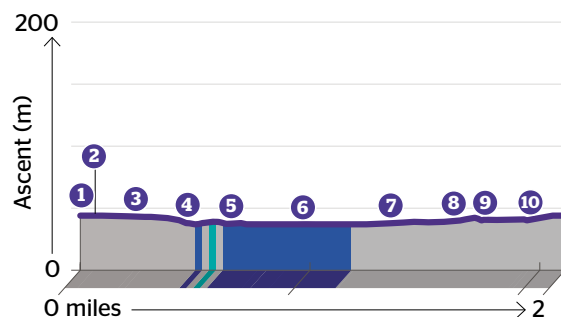

- 1 From the hostel's front door head to the main road (Wellesbourne Road).
- 2 Turn right alongside the main road.
- 3 At the war memorial turn right onto Alveston Lane.
- 4 Take the footpath on the left and pass the church.
- 5 Turn left and follow the path to the weir.
- 6 Retrace your steps to the church and follow the track straight ahead.
- 7 At the road turn left onto The Rookery.
- 8 Turn right onto Ferry Lane, then right onto Kissing Tree Lane.
- 9 Turn left onto Kissing Tree Way.
- 10 Turn left onto Church Lane and to the hostel.
