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Hazards

Crossing busy and fast roads without pedestrian crossings. Some walking on narrow roads without pavements. Deep water close to the route.

Accessibility

There are no stiles on the route. There are single steps greater than 10cm and gates and paths less than one metre wide. The paths though the village and along Llyn Padarn are accessible.

Navigation

Careful navigation is required to follow the faintly worn path across the farmland. Elsewhere the route follows obvious paths and roads.

Terrain

Mostly flat paths and pavements, with some uneven ground over farmland.

- Head along the hostel driveway and turn left onto the road.
- Pass through the farmgate, then follow the road around to the right and uphill.
- Before reaching the end of the road turn left towards a driveway to a house. Before the cattle grid, turn left onto the signed footpath alongside the stone wall.
- Step across the stream and through the gate, then immediately back across stream and follow the path through fields.
- 5 Pass through a gate to the road, then bear right and downhill.
- Turn right onto Church Road and pass under the railway bridge.
- Turn left and continue onto Rhes Fictoria/Victoria Terrace.
- Turn left to head alongside the A4086 and pass the Snowdon Mountain Railway Station.
- After crossing the side road, Maes Padarn, cross the main road to the bus stops area, then bear left.
- Just before the car park turn right onto the footpath and bear left around and behind the Y Ganolfan/Community Centre building.
- Bear right and follow the path alongside playing fields.
