
Toilets on route, including a Changing Places toilet. Lots of food and drink options on Madeira Drive, none on Marine Parade.



- Plan your adventure know what to expect and what you can do.

Share your walks

Route Summary

A gentle walk along the vibrant Brighton seafront. From the hostel turn right, follow the path around to the back of the hostel and alongside the small road to the main seafront road. Turn left to cross the road at the lights, turn left, pass the pier and continue along Madeira Drive. Watch out for cyclists. This area can be very busy at times. Continue along Madeira Drive and enjoy the art, cafés, shops and attractions. After the play park and Halfway station bear left onto Dukes Mound, take the road uphill or the steps to reach Marine Parade and head back in the direction of the pier. The higher road provides an elevated view of the sea and attractive buildings. Head back down to Madeira Drive using the steps opposite Rock Place or the ramp opposite Margaret Street and retrace the route to the hostel. To avoid going uphill on Duke's Mound turn around and head back the way you came along Madeira Drive. Take care crossing the roads. If heading into the sea then check the tide times, be aware of underwater drops and keep away from the groynes.

Accessibility

The route is tarmac or paved and can be entirely step free with dropped kerbs. There is step free access to the pier and from Madeira Drive to the aquarium, though not all of the aquarium is step free. Various step free access points to the beach along the route. The incline on Duke's Mound between Madeira Drive and Marine Parade is approximately 500 metres long and rises by 15 metres (1:33). Changing Places toilet on the lower road.

Points of interest (see map)

The Youth Hostel is an example of Regency Architecture and there are many other fine examples in the area. There is lots to see and do including:

- 1 The Pier with amusement arcades, restaurant, takeaway food and fairground rides (to the end of the pier and back is about one kilometre)
- 2 Aquarium
- 3 Brighton Beach, can be accessed various points along Madeira Drive
- 4 Zip line
- 5 Crazy golf
- 6 Volks Electric Railway station
- 7 Anchor from Athina B stranded on the beach in 1980
- 8 Olympian Steve Ovett statue
- 9 Beach sports (volleyball)
- 10 Play park
- **11** Volks Electric Railway station, catch the train further along the beach or back to the aquarium
- 12 Crazy Golf
- 13 Victorian lift.
