Route Summary

A whistlestop walk through some of the sights, attractions and shopping areas of Brighton and Hove. From the hostel turn left onto Old Steine, follow the path around to the right, turn left onto Castle Square and right onto Pavilion Buildings. Head under India Gate to enter the gardens and take the second path on the left. Turn right to leave the gardens onto Church Street and turn left. Turn left onto New Road, right onto North Street, cross the road at the pedestrian crossing and into the alley straight ahead to The Lanes. This area can be busy. Take the second right onto Union Street to emerge onto Ship Street. Turn right, continue onto Duke Street and straight ahead onto the pedestrianised road. Turn right onto West Street, left onto North Street and bear left onto Western Road, Turn left onto Clarence Square and turn left, right, left, right to Russell Square. Turn right, then left and take the alley in the corner to Regency Square. Turn right onto Preston Street, left onto Western Road to Hove and bear right onto Church Road. Turn right onto Selbourne Road. left onto Eaton Road, left onto George Street and right onto Church Road. Continue to New Church Road, turn left onto Princes Square, left onto Princes Avenue, right onto Hove Street, cross Kingsway and continue to the seafront. Turn left and head back towards Brighton along the seafront. Cross the seafront road at the lights just before the pier, turn left, then right to follow the path around to the front of the hostel. Take care crossing the roads. Watch out for cyclists on the seafront. If heading into the sea then check the tide times, be aware of underwater drops and keep away from the groynes.

Accessibility

The route follows roads, paths and the seafront. No steps, flat surfaces throughout — mostly tarmac, paved or block paved. Most main road crossings have traffic lights and dropped kerbs. Many of the smaller roads have dropped kerbs, but not all. Some narrow pavements in places.

There is lots to see and do on this route with great shopping and interesting architecture. Access to the beach the entire route from Hove back to Brighton.
