Seats mostly in parks, greens and at bus stops. Some on streets elsewhere, but fewer.



- Dog poo bag it and bin it any public waste bin will do
- Plan your adventure know what to expect and what you can do.

Route Summary

A great walk with historic buildings, academic institutions, museums, waterways and shopping. From the hostel turn right onto Tenison Road, left onto Lyndewode Road, left onto Glisson Road, right onto Hills Road and head towards the tall spire. Turn left onto Lensfield Road, right onto Trumpington Street and left at the Pitt Building onto Silver Street. Cross the river pass Queens' College (the large brick building) and turn right into Queens' Green. Follow the path alongside the water and across the green. Join Queen's Road to pass the King's College gates and follow the path running parallel to the water. Turn right onto Garret Hostel Lane and cross the river. Turn left onto Trinity Lane and follow it around to the right. Turn left onto Trinity Street which becomes St John's Street and turn left onto Bridge Street. Immediately before the bridge turn right onto Quayside, follow along the river to Jesus Green and at the footbridge take the path ahead and to the right (to the left of the toilets) across the green. Cross over Victoria Avenue, turn right, then take the path diagonally and to the right across Midsummer Common. Cross Maids Causeway to Fair Street and continue onto New Square, Jesus Terrace and Clarendon Street. Turn left onto Parkside, take the path diagonally across the park and turn right onto Gonville Place. Turn left onto Hills Road and retrace your steps back to the hostel. Watch out for cyclists throughout the route, take care near water and be aware that some areas are busy tourist hot spots.

Accessibility

The route follows roads with pavements and through parks. No steps, flat surfaces throughout — mostly tarmac or paved with small gravel paths in the park after Queen's College. Most main road crossings have traffic lights and dropped kerbs. Many of the smaller roads have dropped kerbs, but not all. Some narrow pavements in places. No path on Garret Hostel Lane, but it is a quiet access road. Path restriction at the entrance to Jesus Green from Quayside, larger mobility scooters may find it difficult to get through, to avoid cross the river from Bridge Street, turn right onto Chesterton Lane and turn right back across the river using the footbridge.



Points of interest (see map)

The city is full of history to explore and has been largely shaped its waterways and the University. A few highlights include:

- 1 The Polar Museum
- 2 The Fitzwilliam Museum
- 3 Little St Mary's Medieval church
- 4 Market
- 5 The Round Church, unique Medieval church
- 6 Punting
- 7 Lido, outdoor swimming pool.

The University of Cambridge is made up of 31 semi-autonomous colleges which are self-governing and have their own internal structures, activities and memberships. The colleges were founded between the 13th and 20th centuries, but none between 1596 and 1800. College buildings and grounds are spread throughout the city. This route passes many of them.
